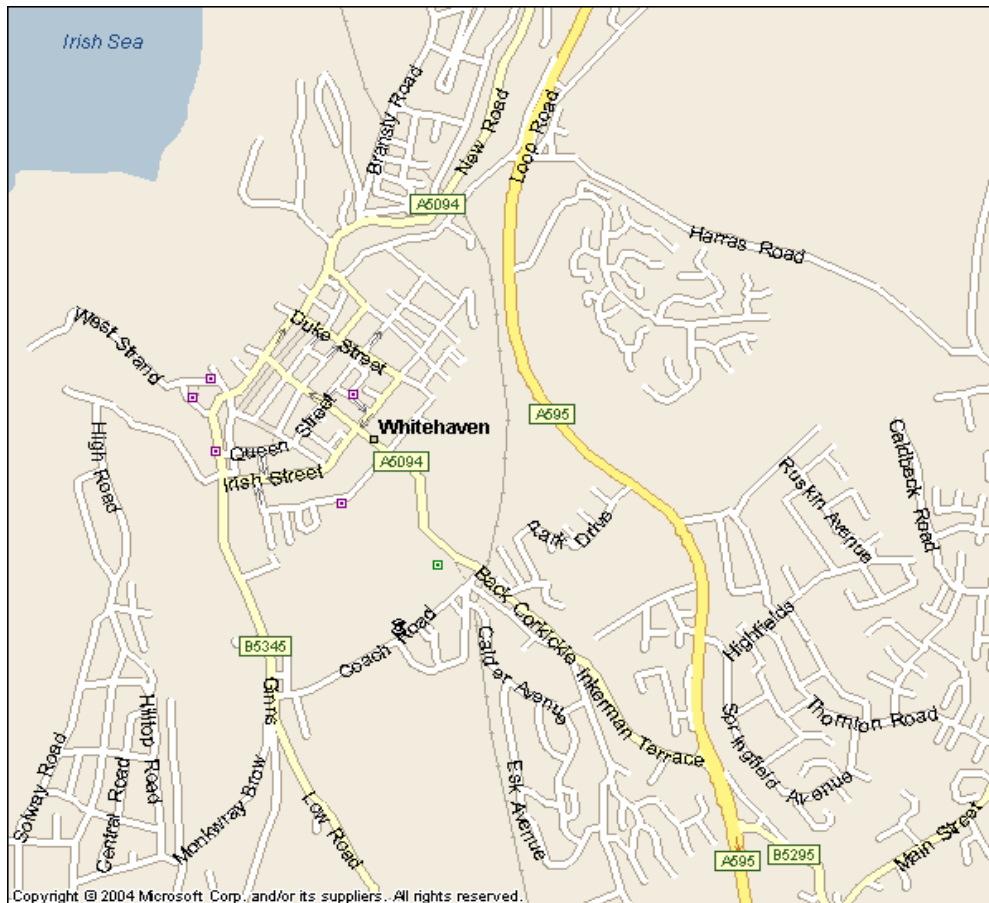


## **Directions to Whitehaven**



### **From the North and East (Newcastle and general area).**

Use the A69 from Newcastle to Carlisle. Then A595 from Carlisle to Whitehaven (there is a short spell on the A66 between two parts of the A595 just past Cockermouth).

### **From the East (Darlington and Middlesbrough area).**

Head for Scotch Corner on the A1 then follow the A66 to Penrith.

Continue to follow the A66 past Keswick and Cockermouth then at the roundabout take the A595 signposted Whitehaven and Barrow.

### **On Entering Whitehaven**

#### **From the North - The easy way**

On seeing the sign "Whitehaven" as you enter the town, keep to the left lane of traffic. This will take you past the garage on your right. Keep on this road (The Loop Road), which will give you panoramic views of the town to your right, until you come to a set of traffic lights. You need the RIGHT hand lane which brings you down the hill (Inkerman Terrace) and past the Chase Hotel on your left.

At the bottom of the bank, at the traffic lights with the petrol station to your left, turn left.

As the road bears left, turn right onto Coach Road. across the hatched area down a slight hill. The Catholic Church will be on your right hand side. Travel on until you see a sign on your left indicating a cycleway (just past and on the opposite side of the road to Jewsons). Turn in and follow the path until you meet the gates to the complex. The clubhouse is at the bottom of the access road.

If you reach the Recreation Ground (Whitehaven Rugby League Ground) you have gone too far!  
Note: The cycle track is actually big enough for cars and coaches to enter in single file, though passing places are provided.

### **On Entering Whitehaven**

#### **From the North - Through Town:**

When approaching from the north on the A595 upon seeing the "Whitehaven Town Centre" sign entering town, take the right hand lane for "Town Centre". Follow the road into the town, past Tesco on your right, Weatherspoons on your left, and follow the One Way system. This brings you past "North" on the corner, and "The Ship" on your left. Keep to the Left past the Police station and follow round until you come to traffic lights. Turn LEFT which takes you past The Civic Hall on your right. Keep in the left lane as you pass Morrisons on your right. Pass through the traffic lights until you come to another set of lights and you need to be in the RIGHT hand lane. This is the junction to take you down Coach Road..

As the road bears left, turn right onto Coach Road. across the hatched area down a slight hill. The Catholic Church will be on your right hand side. Travel on until you see a sign on your left indicating a cycleway (just past and on the opposite side of the road to Jewsons). Turn in and follow the path until you meet the gates to the complex. The clubhouse is at the bottom of the access road.

### **On Entering Whitehaven**

**From the South:** From the A595 take the turning signposted 'Whitehaven Town Centre' at the top of Inkermann Terrace at the traffic lights. Come down the hill past the Chase Hotel on your left until you come to a further set of traffic lights just next to the Esso Garage. Turn LEFT into Coach Road. As the road bears left, turn right onto Coach Road. across the hatched area down a slight hill. The Catholic Church will be on your right hand side. Travel on until you see a sign on your left indicating a cycleway (just past and on the opposite side of the road to Jewsons). Turn in and follow the path until you meet the gates to the complex. The clubhouse is at the bottom of the access road.
